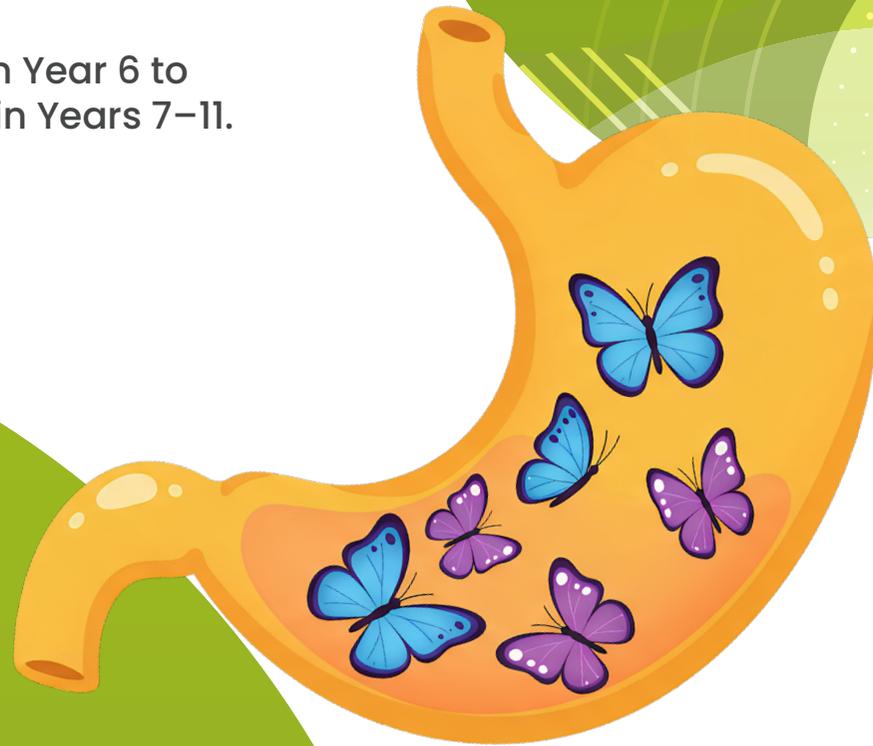

By coming to TRUST Education Group, trying new things, and asking for help when you need it, you are already doing something really AMAZING.

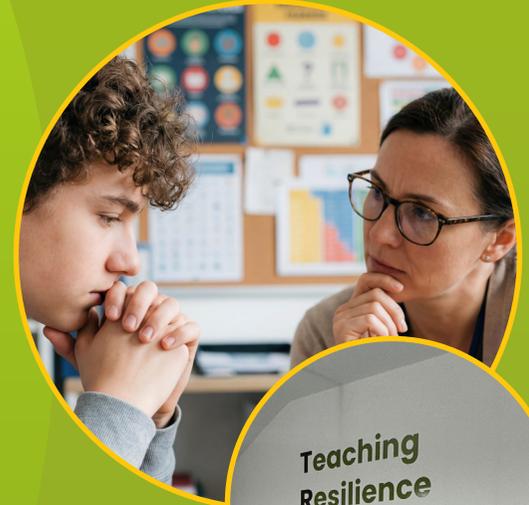
